# Reflection

## February 2026

It feels a bit late now, but Happy New Year to you!

As many of you know, it wasn't the greatest Christmas and New Year in the Fletcher household with various bouts of ill-health. It certainly marred the festivities and meant that it was a little way into January before I really felt that I had got going again.

However, it did show the Church in its best light. There were people who have gone above and beyond in not just offering, but also providing, practical support to Helen and me over this time that enabled us just to keep going. We have also been touched by the messages, cards, and emails we have received from people expressing care and concern for us. My apologies for those I haven't managed to reply to, but know that they did keep us going during difficult times.

In the middle of this month many in our society (whether they have a Christian affiliation or not) will mark St. Valentine's Day. There will be cards aplenty telling us what true love is like. We have our own definition. In St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, he sets out that the greatest gift they could seek was love. He then detailed the qualities of true love – it is patient, kind, it isn't arrogant or rude, it believes all things, bears all things, hopes all things.

St. John tells us that, as Jesus was preparing those first disciples for his imminent departure, he gave them the commandment that they were to love one another as he had loved them. The humble, self-sacrificing love that we see in Christ is to be our example. He told them, 'By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.'

This love we are called to show should manifest itself in practical actions and expressions of concern. As St. Paul would tell the Corinthians in that same letter it would mean that we would all rejoice when one part of our Church family rejoiced; but that we would all suffer when one part suffered. It is a high calling and a hard calling because there aren't limits to who can receive this love – it isn't only for those we like, or who think as we do, or believe as we do. It is a love that must permeate all our emails and messages, our conversations and actions.

May we seek in this year to come to be people who better fulfil that call to love as Christ loved because it is only then that people will know we are Christ's disciples – by the love that we have for one another.

My joy at seeing this magnificent bird was insurmountable. Last year 3 of these birds were found dead unlawfully killed by game keepers, in Sussex. I thought they were all gone. How wrong I was. We walked to a view point further on and were watching geese which suddenly all took to flight, we looked up and the Eagle was flying just above us it was an amazing sight.

My mum is currently in hospital but she is coping with that okay and will hopefully be home soon. My mother-in-law is in a care home at the moment for respite care and should be going home in the next few weeks so life has been a bit busy at the moment.
