Reflection

October 2025

Each year the incoming President and Vice-President of our Methodist Conference set a theme for the year to come. This year, Rev. Richard Andrew and Mr Matthew Forsyth have introduced the theme 'Our Story, Our Song'. They describe it as 'an encouragement to a journey of discernment as we seek afresh the story God has called us to live and the song God has called us to sing.' Both our congregations of Haywards Heath and Burgess Hill mark our 125th anniversaries in the coming Methodist year. These are opportunities to review our story and the song we have sung, remember the characters who have been part of it, and the voices who have sung our song of faith.

As with any story there are always developments and twists as people come and go, and situations change. We are obviously preparing for such a change this year as Helen and I will be moving on and, we pray, a new minister will be appointed to minister with you into the next chapter of the story, the next verse of the song.

It might be useful for you to know the timeline for this process. On 17th October ministers will be sent the books of Circuits looking for a new minister, and Circuits will be sent the books of ministers on the move. Both ministers and Circuits get the chance to create a list of potential matches. From Monday 10th-Thursday 13th November the Stationing Matching Group meets to try and match all ministers on the move with a potential appointment. In the week or so following visits will happen and decisions will be made.

I obviously won't be able to say anything until everything is decided, and equally the Circuit won't be able to confirm a match until all is confirmed, so do be patient, and we will share all the news we are able to at the appropriate time.

Whilst this may feel an unsettling time, it is also a time of excitement and adventure as we all wait to see where next God leads us in the story of our journey following the path of Christ. Wherever it leads, may we continue to sing the song of God's love and grace with boldness and joy.

Explorers **Helpful People:** We are looking at *Who might help us in an emergency?* RNLI, Police, Ambulance workers, Fire Brigade and Coastguard; *Who might help us to be healthy?* Doctors, Nurses, Dentist, Optician; *Who might help us in School?* Teachers, School Secretary, Diner Ladies, Older Children; *How do builders and decorators help us?* Carpenters, Architects, Decorators, Builders, Plumbers, Electricians and *How can we help others?* Doing jobs around the house, helping our Teacher and Classmates, being kind and gentle with everyone we know and being considerate to others.

Juniors: **Caring:** with Valerie Randell: Making a poster of words relating to Caring eg. Helping, being Kind, Listening, Talking. Discussing how they can Care. Caring for Pets, Caring for Plants, Reading the story of Moses in the Bulrushes and how Pharaoh's Daughter cared for the baby. Doing a short play about Moses in the Bulrushes. Thanking God for people who Care and discussing how God cares for us and His protection is always there.

One of our Brigaders is taking the Senior badge **World Need** looking at other parts of the world which are less wealthy than where we live and whose people struggle from lack of health care, opportunities that we take for granted and, in some parts of the world, dire situations seeking every day needs.

We are supporting the Link to Hope Shoebox Appeal again this year. This charity gives aid to families and the elderly in Ukraine, Moldova, Romania and Bulgaria. A flyer will soon be available regarding items that would be suitable for the shoeboxes. Items need to be given to me by 22 October at the latest, thank you.

At the end of each session, we end up with a game or two and have recently reintroduced *Cooking Pot* to the Explorers, a good fun game to get rid of some surplus energy!

My thanks to Ellie, Valerie, Amorette and Molly for leading the girls in the various activities and to the parents who bring the girls so regularly each week.
